

LITTLE FAMILY (of Boscawen)
Papers, 1810-1902.

The papers seem to have been collected for genealogy. Alfred Little, 1823-1880, was a bachelor, employed as a tuner in a melodeon factory at Concord, gave concerts. He furnished the material for the Little Genealogy, see p. 241.

The most interesting papers are those of Richard Little, 1791-1840. He married 1st Priscilla Plummer and 2d Mary C. Pillsbury and so became guardian of Pillsbury children.
